Dear,

You are aware that we are now implementing the “National Rural Drinking Water Programme” with effect from 1st April 2009. The Department of Drinking Water Supply has held several rounds of discussions while formulating the guidelines and one of the major decisions taken was that States will have to plan for each year taking into consideration the ongoing schemes, new schemes as well as schemes which will require augmentation and link to the habitations which are proposed to be covered through these schemes during that financial year. After the annual shelf of projects (DPRs) is finalized for the year 2010-1,1 it is to be cleared in the State Level Scheme Clearance Committee (SLSCC).

State Action Plan 2010-11 for NRDWP and Jalmani for the year 2010-11 will have to sent by 10/03/2010 and a presentation made to the Department of Drinking Water Supply, Government of India in New Delhi starting from 10th March 2010 for which State-wise schedule will be communicated subsequently.

While finalizing the rural water schemes the following issues should be given priority:

- i. Ongoing schemes should be taken up for completion in the first instance.
- ii. Among the ongoing and new schemes
 1. First priority should be given for coverage of 0% population covered habitations
 2. Second priority should be given for coverage of 0-25% population covered habitations, then 25-50% population covered habitations, 50-75% and lastly for 75-100% population covered habitations.
 3. Among quality affected habitations those affected with chemical contamination of source by arsenic and/or fluoride should be given highest priority followed by those affected by excess iron, salinity, nitrate etc.
- iii. To ensure the assured availability of potable drinking water on sustainable basis in SC/ST dominated habitations, the State/UTs are required to earmark at least 25% of the NRDWP funds for drinking water supply to the SC dominated habitations and another minimum 10% for the ST dominated habitations. In cases where, the States have achieved full coverage of SC/ST habitations, such States/UTs may incur lower level of expenditure on the coverage of SC/ST habitations with the prior approval of DDWS. Where the

- percentage of SC or ST population in a particular State or the existing coverage of SC/ST dominated habitations warrants earmarking/utilization of more than stipulated provisions, additional funds can also be utilized. The list of such SC and ST dominated habitations is indicated in the DDWS web-site.
- iv. Priority in coverage should also be given to minority dominated habitations in 1178 blocks in 90 districts identified by the Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India which are indicated in the DDWS web –site.
 - v. Districts severely affected by Left Wing Extremism (LWE) as per the Government of India list which is also available in DDWS web-site should be given higher per capita allocation and release of funds.
 - vi. Wherever required and feasible, ongoing and new schemes should have a component of sustainability which may include rain water harvesting and ground water recharging structures to be taken up under sustainability fund for which 20% of the State allocation is earmarked and provided as 100% grant by Government of India.
 - vii. A plan for involving community in planning, monitoring and O&M of schemes including VWSC/ Pani Samiti formation/ activation, awareness generation and training activities has to be prepared using support activity fund.
 - viii. O&M Plan giving details of amounts to be transferred to Panchayats and amounts to be spent on various heads to be prepared.
 - ix. Waste water management plan giving numbers and estimated cost of low cost waste water management structures to be taken up by convergence with NREGS/ TSC etc. in habitations to be served by PWSS.
 - x. Jalmani Plan giving number of schools identified for coverage and estimated cost.
 - xi. Water Quality Monitoring Plan giving numbers of grass root level workers to be trained, FTKs to be distributed, labs to be set up, samples to be tested.
 - xii. Details of other support activities under MIS & Computerization, Research and Development, Monitoring & Evaluation etc for the year 2010-11 also needs to be prepared and incorporated as a part of the plan.
 - xiii. Actions initiated with regards to transfer of RWS schemes to PRIs/ Community for operation and maintenance with especial reference to bulk metering in case of multi-village schemes, tariff structure for individual and public taps and collection needs to be reflected in the presentation

The Action Plan 2010-11 will have to be prepared in the enclosed Template with 10 Tables and district-wise formats 1 to 11.

It should be submitted by 10th March, 2010 in hard and soft copies.

Schedule of presentations to be made by States will be sent shortly.
