Notice for award of IVA Contract

- **Project Name:** *Swachh Bharat Mission Support Operation*
- **Loan No.:** 8559 – IN **Contract No.** MDWS/IVA/2
- Ministry of drinking water & Sanitation had invited EOIs for engagement of an Independent Verification Agency (IVA) as part of the World Bank funded project to conduct a National Annual Rural Sanitation Survey (NARSS). After evaluating 19 Proposals, 6 (six) agencies were shortlisted on the basis of Expression of interest and following six firms submitted their RFP proposal:-
 1. M/s IPSOS Public Affairs, IPSOS India with NR Management Consultants Pvt. Ltd.
 2. M/s IPE Global Limited India, with IMRB International.
 3. M/s AMS Consulting Research Training.
 4. M/s Nielsen (India) P. Ltd.
 5. M/s AFC India Ltd.
 6. M/s Sambodhi Research & Communication P. Ltd.
- The RFP proposals of six firms were examined/evaluated and were assigned ranks as shown in the **Table A** below (along with the scores against each firm).



- Date of signing of Contract: **19.05.2017**
- Value of Contract: **Rs.37, 85, 47,149 exclusive of local indirect taxes.**
- **Period of Contract:** The contract shall be for 5 assessment cycles (i.e 60 months). The continuation of the Contract will be subject to satisfactory annual performance review.
- **Summary scope of the Contract:** The Government of India launched , Swachh Bharat Mission – Gramin [(SBM(G)] programme, on 2nd October 2014. This program represents a renewed commitment to accelerate efforts towards achieving an open defecation free (ODF) and clean rural India, by 2nd October 2019. As part of SBM (G), both outputs and outcomes are to be monitored. For this, the outcomes need to be defined in terms of clearly measurable indicators. Government of India has taken loan from the World Bank (World Bank Support Operation to Swachh Bharat Mission) to put in place an incentive mechanism for the States for achieving the goal of SBM(G). This incentive mechanism is based on three outcomes called Disbursement Linked Indicators (DLIs)- reduction in the population practicing open defecation; achieving and sustaining open defecation free (ODF) status of villages; and population with access to improved Solid and Liquid Waste Management (SLWM).

To measure the three DLIs, a National Annual Rural Sanitation Survey (NARSS) shall be conducted for five Annual rounds, starting in Financial Year 2017-18. The baseline round is expected to start in July 2017, followed by four more annual rounds. The NARSS shall measure and provide statistically representative estimates for progress made by for all States/UT against the DLIs. Based on the above, the IVA shall conduct NARSS and shall provide the reports to MDWS that will form the basis for release of Performance Incentives to States. The IVA shall be responsible for the conduct of the NARSS and for producing independent verification reports for submission to MDWS.
